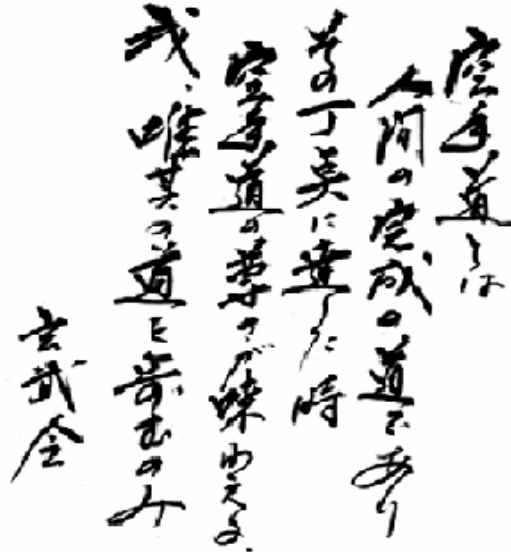


Genbu-Kai Dojo Kun (Precepts)



As a student and representative of The Dojo, it is your responsibility to help us provide a friendly and respectful environment to diligently study, demonstrate and teach traditional martial arts. The following precepts, all equally important, are simple guidelines to training and life:

Japanese: Hitotsu ... Rei setsu o omon zuru koto.
Translation: One. Be courteous.
Meaning: Be courteous in your manners.

Japanese: Hitotsu ... Tadashii kokoro o motte seiken to suru koto.
Translation: One. Keep the heart pure and the fist sacred.
Meaning: Have a strong sense of justice.

Japanese: Hitotsu ... Kageki naru gen do kooi o tsutsushimu koto.
Translation: One. Refrain from inappropriate speech and conduct.
Meaning: Be responsible for your words and actions.

Japanese: Hitotsu ... Ai shinji te wasuru koto.
Translation: One. Trust one another and create harmony.
Meaning: Respect one another.

Japanese: Hitotsu ... Kyu do no seishin o okota zaru koto.
Translation: One. Maintain the spirit along the road to perfection.
Meaning: Karate-do is the way of the spirit to give you courage and ambition to reach your goals as part of your life.
